### *A Message from the Rector*

#### A New Time to Glorify God

I have heard people say that we are losing the 9:15 service. That is not true. Or if it is, then we are also losing our 11:00 service. Let me see if I can be more clear.

As you should know by now beginning September 5<sup>th</sup> we are going to new service times: 8:00 and 10:30. So, technically speaking, we will have neither a 9:15 service, that is a service at that time, nor an 11:00 service. But what I am saying is more than that. The real concern, obviously, is with the style of the service, its music, etc. The question is: What will the 10:30 service be like? I met with the Worship Commission in July to discuss this very thing. I would have to say that where we will end up is yet to be seen, but the 10:30 service will be both a combination of the two styles of the previous two services, and more than that.

The commission agreed on a philosophical outline for what the new 10:30 service will be like. We agreed that the service and the music should: a) be exciting (as liturgically appropriate), b) include hymns that are largely familiar and easy to sing, c) remain true to our roots in the Episcopal tradition and the local tradition of Christ Church, d) utilize all of our current resources, i.e. The Hymnal 1982, Lift Every Voice and Sing II, and Wonder, Love & Praise, e) perhaps explore some new sources of music, f) utilize the copious talents of our musicians –Hannah, Kris, and Lydia, g) be creative with the instrumentation of music (see item “f”), and h) be open to new ideas.

The choir at 10:30 will be vested and seated in the choir pews, but we hope that everyone who was part of the 11:00 choir *and* the 9:15 “Small but Mighty Singers” will join the group. We plan on making the first Sunday of the month a service that focuses especially on children and families. We are exploring creative ways to do this, including children’s sermon, music, and having children take active roles in the liturgy. During Communion we will use the wafers instead of fresh bread or pita. We also plan on doing some themed services, maybe once a month, to see how people like them. Themes may be a chanted service, Jazz service, a Celtic service, perhaps even Reggae ☺.

What we will not do is have a rock band with lyrics projected on the wall –nothing against this style of worship, but it is available elsewhere and not what the people on the commission felt called to do. I actually foresee a period of experimentation in which we try out new things and see how people like them. Perhaps it makes sense to consider the whole next year as a time for experimentation. One thing is for sure, we will not please everyone all the time. I beg your indulgence as we seek to discover a new and unique style for our worship of God, all the time seeking to glorify God and build up the Kingdom of God.

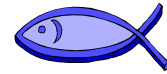

# SAINT OF THE MONTH

September 17

*Hildegard of Bingen* died 1179



One of the most fascinating figures of 12<sup>th</sup> century Europe, Hildegard, was raised in a convent, having been given to the church by her parents. From childhood Hildegard was subject to supernatural religious experiences which she often wrote about in works she called *Scivias*. She became abbess of the convent in which she was raised at age 38. The community prospered under her guidance and moved to new buildings near Bingen in Swabia.

Hildegard began to illustrate her *Scivias* and to share them with others. She attracted the attention of two of the most powerful men of her day – the Emperor Frederick Barbarossa and Abbot Bernard of Clairvaux. She was invited to do preaching missions and traveled widely in northern Europe where she was graciously received by princes and prelates.

Hildegard's writings covered an amazing range of subjects: natural science, medicine and philosophy as well as theology. She carried on brilliant correspondence with kings and queens, abbots, archbishops and even popes. She was an accomplished musician and wrote remarkable liturgical compositions. Some have considered her ahead of her time, a herald of the Renaissance. Hildegard was a truly medieval character, the very personification of the age in which she lived. She was a strict moralist and her writings are full of appeals to purity. Miracles were attributed to her.

## Nursery UPDATE

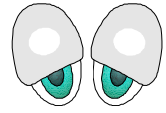

# CONGREGATIONAL HEALTH CORNER

*Bedtime Snacks that REALLY Help You Sleep*

September 2010



Forget what Mom told you: a glass of warm milk before bed might actually keep you awake rather than lull you to sleep. The protein in the milk will boost alertness and – unless its skim milk – the fat will slow your digestion, making your sleep more fitful than restful. (Sorry, Mom) Here are a few substitutes for warm milk that are more effective and tastier, too.

- **Nonfat popcorn** – Pop a bag half an hour before bedtime. The carbohydrates will induce your body to create serotonin, a neurochemical that makes you feel relaxed. Skip the butter so you don't slow down the process of boosting the chemicals and digestion in general.
- **Oatmeal with sliced bananas** – Sleep is inspired by the hormone melatonin, but stress or excitement can disrupt the release of melatonin. Bring your brain back down to earth with a bowl of instant oatmeal topped with a sliced banana, which is rich in melatonin.
- **A handful of sesame seeds** – Sesame seeds are one of the best natural sources of tryptophan, the sleep-inducing amino acid responsible for the post-Thanksgiving turkey coma.
- **Pretzels** – Pretzels are a source of carbohydrates, which make you feel sleepy; since pretzels are also low in calories and fat, they won't cause weight gain or give you indigestion.
- **A glass of wine** – It's called a nightcap for a reason – a glass of wine induces relaxation and reduces stress. Researchers have discovered that one alcoholic drink causes the blood vessels to relax but two begins to reverse the effect, so limit intake. Relaxed blood vessels result in lower blood pressure, slower heart rate and greater ability to relax in general.
- **A four-ounce glass of unsweetened cherry juice** – Cherry juice has serotonin-inducing carbohydrates which will help you relax. Drinking the juice about an hour before bedtime will cause the little jolt of sugar to dissipate before you fall asleep.
- **Don't forget to say your prayers.**
